SUBJECT: AGRICULTURAL WATER ELIGIBILITY

BACKGROUND:

At the Vallecitos Board meeting of May 16, 2018, Robert Case, owner of a single-family residence at 872 Flynn Heights Drive, requested approval of an agricultural water rate. Additional background information on this subject (Item 2 from the December 10, 2018, Public Awareness/Personnel/Policy Committee Meeting) is attached. Included among the attachments are copies of District Ordinances 171 and 207. Also attached is the annual certification form which customers submit to maintain their status as an agricultural water customer.

Per the SDCWA, "Agricultural water customers are required to use water for the growing or raising, in conformity with recognized practices of husbandry, for the purposes of commerce, trade, or industry, or agricultural, horticultural, or floriculture products, and produced (1) for human consumption or for the market, or (2) for the feeding of fowl or livestock produced for human consumption or for the market, or (3) for the feeding of fowl or livestock for the purpose of obtaining their products for human consumption or for the market, such products to be grown or raised on a parcel of land having an area of not less than one acre fully utilized exclusively therefore."

Commercial water accounts apply to customers that are non-residential, such as restaurants, hotels, strip malls, laundries, hospitals, gas stations and car washes, to name a few.

At the May 16 Board meeting, Public Information/Conservation Supervisor Robbins reported that existing Vallecitos Rate Ordinance 207 is silent on the subject of customers enrolling in the "Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate" (CNPAWR) account classification. The District currently has 22 accounts categorized as "AO" or "CO" which are our CNPAWR accounts. The Board requested additional information about agricultural water rates.

At the August 21, 2018, Public Awareness/Personnel/Policy Committee Meeting Supervisor Robbins presented information on:

- 1) How the CNPAWR rate came about;
- 2) How agricultural water had been "grandfathered" in previous ordinances;
- 3) Provided copies of Ordinances 165 and 207;
- 4) Provided information on customers interested in CNPAWR water; and,
- 5) Explained revenue loss (decrease of \$4.04 for each unit of Tier 3 water that is charged at Tier 2.)

Board members requested additional information on the expected revenue loss and if there was any logic or intent to leaving Ordinance 207 silent on the subject of CNPAWR.

At the December 10, 2018, Public Awareness/Personnel/Policy Committee Meeting Supervisor Robbins presented information on:

- 1) Additional customers requesting agricultural water: Lynne Thuen, Michael Rote, Bridget Rose and Nathan Larson.
- Research did not reveal any reason for Ordinance 207 to be silent on the subject of CNPAWR.
- 3) BB&K Attorney Kelly Salt indicated it was not clear how the District could restrict access to CNPAWR based on the current ordinance.
- 4) Attorney Salt recommended this be corrected in future ordinances. She also recommended there be a "lower level of service" (mandatory reduction in time of drought or a drought rate) that could be invoked for CNPAWR accounts.
- 5) Financial Analyst, Mike Arthur reviewed two accounts to show how much revenue would be lost in a one-year period if the existing customers were moved from their current category to the CNPAWR.
 - a. If the District were to allow Hokto Kinoko to transfer its two 2" commercial meters to the CNPAWR, the annual loss of revenue, based on last year's data, would total \$81,894.04.
 - b. If the District were to allow Michael Rote to transfer his 5/8" residential meter to the CNPAWR, the annual loss of revenue, based on last year's data, would total \$1,285.88.

COMMITTEE DIRECTION:

The consensus of the Committee was to offer a pilot program for agricultural rates for one year and evaluate the results during the next cost of service and study. Staff was also directed to draft revised text to the Rate Ordinance for review and discussion and to come up with a new name for Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate (CNPAWR).

DISCUSSION:

Staff recommends the Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate (CNPAWR) be renamed to: Water for Agriculture and Irrigation - Vallecitos Rate (WAIVR). The current Rate Ordinance (207) can be revised to either allow or deny new customers into the WAIVR rate.

Ordinance text to allow new and existing customer access to WAIVR.

Agricultural Water Rates: Agricultural customers that are certified by the Vallecitos Water District as having at least one acre fully planted for commercial use and meeting other program requirements and participate in the San Diego County Water Authority's Transitional Special Agricultural Water Rate (TSAWR) program receive a discount in 2019 of \$0.84 on each unit (100 cubic feet) of agricultural water metered. In order to be enrolled in TSAWR, the customer meter account must have been enrolled in the Metropolitan Water District's Interim Agricultural Water Program (IAWP) program as of January 1, 2009. Agricultural customers not participating in TSAWR are eligible for the Water for Agriculture and Irrigation - Vallecitos Rate (WAIVR) as long as they meet WAIVR program requirements. The WAIVR rate is set at Tier 2 for all water consumed. The first 26 units for combined Agricultural/Irrigation/Domestic services are considered domestic use and not agricultural.

Ordinance text to deny access to WAIVR.

Agricultural Water Rates: Agricultural customers that are certified by the Vallecitos Water District as having at least one acre fully planted for commercial use and meeting other program requirements and participate in the San Diego County Water Authority's Transitional Special Agricultural Water Rate (TSAWR) program receive a discount in 2019 of \$0.84 on each unit (100 cubic feet) of agricultural water metered. In order to be enrolled in TSAWR, the customer meter account must have been enrolled in the Metropolitan Water District's Interim Agricultural Water Program (IAWP) program as of January 1, 2009. Agricultural customers not participating in TSAWR are eligible for the Water for Agriculture and Irrigation - Vallecitos Rate (WAIVR) as long as they meet WAIVR program requirements. In order to be enrolled in WAIVR, the customer meter account must have been enrolled in the Metropolitan Water District's Interim Agricultural Water Program (IAWP) program as of January 1, 2009. The WAIVR rate is set at Tier 2 for all water consumed. The first 26 units for combined Agricultural/Domestic services are considered domestic use and not agricultural.

ALTERNATIVE:

Should the Board's direction be to deny access to agricultural rates for new and existing customers, an alternative solution may be to consider an irrigation rate during the next cost of service and rate study. Irrigation rates are typically used by water agencies for meters that irrigate landscapes only with no interior usage. An irrigation rate is typically more than an agricultural rate, but like an agricultural rate, has no tiers.

PILOT PROGRAM:

Staff has created a draft WAIVR Pilot Program enrollment form for Committee review before finalizing and taking to the full Board of Directors. WAIVR Pilot Program participants would be enrolled for one year in the "AO" or "CO" billing categories. Rates would be flatlined at Tier 2 except for "CO" (combined residential) accounts which would be at Tier 2 except for the first 26 units of water per month, which are billed at the standard residential rate. Staff would provide an update for Board review after one year.

At the Vallecitos Board meeting of May 16, 2018, Robert Case, owner of a single-family residence at 872 Flynn Heights Drive requested approval of an agricultural water rate. Additional background information on this subject (Item 2.1 from the May 16, 2018, Board Meeting and Item 4 from the August 21, 2018, Public Awareness/Personnel/Policy Committee Meeting) are attached as well as copies of District Ordinances 171 and 207. Also attached is the annual certification form which customers submit to maintain their status as an agricultural water customer.

Agricultural water customers are required to use water for the growing or raising, in conformity with recognized practices of husbandry, for the purposes of commerce, trade, or industry, or agricultural, horticultural, or floriculture products, and produced (1) for human consumption or for the market, or (2) for the feeding of fowl or livestock produced for human consumption or for the market, or (3) for the feeding of fowl or livestock for the purpose of obtaining their products for human consumption or for the market, such products to be grown or raised on a parcel of land having an area of not less than one acre fully utilized exclusively therefore. Commercial water accounts apply to customers such as restaurants, hotels, strip malls, laundries, hospitals, gas stations and car washes, to name a few.

At the May 16 Board meeting, Public Information/Conservation Supervisor Robbins reported that existing Vallecitos Ordinance 207 is silent on the subject of customers enrolling in Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate (CNPAWR) accounts. The Board requested additional information about agricultural water rates.

At the August 21, 2018, Public Awareness/Personnel/Policy Committee Meeting Supervisor Robbins presented information on:

- 1) How the CNPAWR rate came about;
- 2) How agricultural water hand been "grandfathered" in previous ordinances;
- 3) Provided copies of Ordinance 165 and 207;
- 4) Provided information on customers interested in CNPAWR water; and,
- 5) Explained revenue loss (decrease of \$4.04 for each unit of Tier 3 water that is charged at Tier 2.

Board members requested additional information on the expected revenue loss and if there was any logic or intent to leaving Ordinance 207 silent on the subject of CNPAWR.

DISCUSSION:

Research did not uncover any reason for Ordinance 207 to be silent on the subject of CNPAWR. Since the summer PAPP Committee meeting, four more customers have requested agricultural water: Lynne Thuen, Michael Rote, Bridget Rose and Nathan Larson.

Supervisor Robbins consulted with Attorney Kelly Salt from BB&K regarding this topic. Ms. Salt's comments indicated it was not clear how the District could restrict access to CNPAWR based on the current ordinance. She recommended this be corrected in future ordinances. She also recommended there be a "lower level of service" (mandatory reduction in time of drought or a drought rate) that could be invoked for CNPAWR accounts.

Financial Analyst, Mike Arthur reviewed two of the accounts to show how much revenue would be lost in a one-year period if the existing customers were moved from their current category to the CNPAWR.

Hokto Kinoko (Commercial Property)

If the District were to allow Hokto Kinoko to transfer its two 2" commercial meters to the CNPAWR, the annual loss of revenue, based on last year's data, would total \$81,894.04 (see attached spreadsheets 1a and 1b).

Michael Rote (Residential Property)

If the District were to allow Michael Rote to transfer his 5/8" residential meter to the CNPAWR, the annual loss of revenue, based on last year's data, would total \$1,285.88 (see attached spreadsheet 2).

The District currently has 22 accounts categorized as AO or CO which are our CNPAWR accounts.

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AGRICULTURAL WATER TO REPLACE SINGLE

FAMILY RESIDENCE RATE AT APN 187-560-16 (LIONTRIBE, LLC)

BACKGROUND:

Robert Case, owner of the subject property, sole member of Liontribe, LLC, has requested approval of an agricultural water rate account for an existing single-family residential metered account on the above-referenced property. The subject property is located within the District's water service boundary at 872 Flynn Heights Drive.

DISCUSSION:

In the past, neither the San Diego County Water Authority (CWA) nor Vallecitos (VWD) has granted new accounts into the agricultural water rate programs. Agricultural accounts are typically grandfathered into the billing system per the following requirements, contained in the "Annual Certification and Enrollment Form" for agricultural water accounts:

- In accordance with San Diego County Water Authority (CWA) rules, VWD and Owner acknowledge that Agricultural Water Rate Programs shall be limited to water used for the growing or raising, in conformity with recognized practices of husbandry, for the purposes of commerce, trade, or industry, or agricultural, horticultural, or floriculture products, and produced (1) for human consumption or for the market, or (2) for the feeding of fowl or livestock produced for human consumption or for the market, or (3) for the feeding of fowl or livestock for the purpose of obtaining their products for human consumption or for the market, such products to be grown or raised on a parcel of land having an area of not less than one acre fully utilized exclusively therefore.
- Minimum of one acre densely planted for commercial purposes.
- The customer meter account must have been enrolled in Metropolitan Water District's Interim Agricultural Water Program (IAWP) as of January 1, 2009.
- Meter and account must be in compliance with all VWD ordinances, resolutions, rules, and regulations.

Specifically, the CWA does not grant their Transitional Special Agricultural Water Rate (TSAWR) to accounts that were not enrolled in the IAWP as of January 1, 2009. VWD has no ability to change CWA requirements. TSAWR customers receive a reduced agricultural water rate, but in times of drought must reduce their consumption by the same percentage as any mandated water supply reductions.

VWD has a separate agricultural water rate that is not part of CWA's program. Titled the "Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate (CNPAWR)," it was established in mid-2009 to provide agricultural water to customers concerned about the TSAWR program's drought restrictions. This rate is not discounted to the same level as TSAWR water, but does not have mandatory restrictions in times of drought. In the past, VWD

has followed the CWA's requirements and has not granted VWD's CNPAWR to accounts that were not enrolled in the IAWP as of January 1, 2009. Previous rate Ordinances (Nos. 165 and 171) were restrictive of access to the CNPAWR, however, current Ordinance No. 207 is silent on the subject of CNPAWR accounts.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the District update and clarify existing Ordinance No. 207 with regard to CNPAWR accounts. A report will also be provided to the Board listing the pros and cons of making this change to help determine if VWD should offer the CNPAWR to current and future customers.

At the May 16 Board meeting, Public Information/Conservation Supervisor Robbins reported that existing Vallecitos Ordinance 207 is silent on the subject of customers enrolling in Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate (CNPAWR) accounts. The Board requested additional information about agricultural water rates.

DISCUSSION:

As a refresher, the San Diego County Water Authority (CWA) does not grant their Transitional Special Agricultural Water Rate (TSAWR) to accounts that were not enrolled in the IAWP as of January 1, 2009. VWD has no ability to change CWA requirements. TSAWR customers receive a reduced agricultural water rate, but in times of drought must reduce their consumption by the same percentage as any mandated water supply reductions.

VWD has a separate agricultural water rate that is not part of CWA's program. Titled the "Certified Non-Participating Agricultural Water Rate (CNPAWR)" it was established in mid-2009 to provide agricultural water to customers concerned about the TSAWR program's drought restrictions. This rate is not discounted to the same level as TSAWR water but does not have mandatory restrictions in times of drought. In the past, VWD has followed the CWA's requirements and has not granted VWD's CNPAWR to accounts that were not enrolled in the IAWP as of January 1, 2009. Previous rate Ordinances (165 and 171) were restrictive of access to the CNPAWR, however, current Ordinance 207 is silent on the subject of CNPAWR accounts.

Robert Case

Robert Case made the original request for agricultural water when the existing property only had a residential meter. In previous years, Mr. Case would have been denied the request by the language of the ordinance. However, now that the ordinance is silent on the subject, there appears to be no reason to deny Mr. Case's request.

Hokto Kinoko

Two representatives from Hokto Kinoko visited the Board meeting on May 16, 2018: Vice President, Kazumi (Kaz) Ikeda and Food Safety Manager, Misch Ibarra. Both gentlemen requested assistance with water rates.

Public Information/Conservation staff visited the Hokto Kinoko site to determine if it should be included in the CNPAWR water program. After a very thorough tour, this customer appears not only to be an agricultural customer, but perhaps produces the most agricultural products annually within the District's service area.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the District approve CNPAWR accounts for the previously listed candidates. For the next rate Ordinance, the District should update and clarify the language.

ORDINANCE NO. 171

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VALLECITOS WATER DISTRICT REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 165 AND ESTABLISHING RATES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS FOR WATER SERVICE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Vallecitos Water District as follows:

SECTION 1: The Board of Directors finds and determines that the following facts are true and correct:

Section 1.1: The Vallecitos Water District ("District") has the authority to establish water rates and charges for services provided within the District boundaries in accordance with Water Code Section 31024, et seq.

Section 1.2: At least 45 days prior to July 20, 2011, public notice was provided detailing the need for increases and specifying uses of revenues generated from the increase.

Section 1.3: Having heard, reviewed and considered, the staff report and information from interested persons who have had an opportunity to express their views, and being advised of the proposed changes and increases in rates, the Board of Directors finds that it is in the best interests of the District and the customers served to approve the changes in rates contained in this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 2:</u> In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines Section 15061, the Board of Directors ordains that the water rate fees established by this ordinance are exempt from CEQA for the following reasons:

- 1. The water rates are not a "project" as defined by Guidelines Section 15378;
- 2. The project is exempt in accordance with Guidelines Section 15273(1), 15273(3), and 15274(4); and
- 3. The activity will not have any significant effect upon the environment pursuant to Guidelines Sections 15061(b) (3).

<u>SECTION 3:</u> The Board of Directors of the District orders and directs that the foregoing exemptions and reasons be made a part of the Notice of Exemption and that the Notice of Exemption be filed with the County Clerk of the County of San Diego.

Multiple Unit Charge:

In addition to the monthly Ready-to-Serve charge based on meter size, on meters that serve more than one dwelling unit, there will be a monthly Multiple Unit Charge of \$11.57 (\$6.39 retail and \$5.18 estimated wholesale) for 2011/12 and \$12.52 (\$6.39 retail and \$6.13 estimated wholesale) for 2012/13 for each dwelling space exceeding the first one.

"Frugal Water Users" Credit:

Retail Charge:

- A Unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or 748 gallons.
- The qualifications for Agricultural service are defined by Metropolitan Water District (MWD). Eligibility for credit from MWD and the Water Authority requires certification to participate in the Metropolitan Water District Interim Agricultural Water Program (IAWP) and the Water Authority Special Agricultural Water Rate Program (SAWR). Agricultural customers not participating in either IAWP or SAWR are eligible for the Certified Non-Participating rate providing they certify to the District that they meet the requirements set forth by MWD for IAWP. Agricultural customers must be certified with the District under the qualifications defined within MWD's IAWP program in order to be categorized in the agricultural tier. Noncertified agricultural services are subject to the other meter size categories.

<u>SECTION 5:</u> Ordinance No. 75, Article 7, Services and Meters, Section 46, Meters Test-Deposits is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE 7. SERVICES AND METERS

<u>SECTION 46. METER TESTS - DEPOSIT:</u> If a customer desires to have the meter serving his premises tested, he shall deposit the charge for testing with the District as follows:

<u>SECTION 6:</u> Ordinance No. 75, Article 12, Temporary Meters, Section 70, Construction Meter is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE 12. TEMPORARY METER INSTALLATIONS

<u>SECTION 70. CONSTRUCTION METER:</u> Upon application to the District and the payment of applicable fees as noted under "deposit" below, a construction meter may be installed to provide water service for construction purposes. Construction meters shall be available to the applicant for 90 days; however, this time may be extended at the discretion of the General Manager.

Deposit:

A deposit of \$800.00 for any size construction meter is required at the time application is made. This deposit, less any outstanding accrued charges, will be refunded when the meter is returned to the District is good working order.

Installation:

A fee of \$90.00 is charged for the installation and removal of the fire hydrant construction meter.

Change of Location:

A fee of \$45.00 is charged for the relocation of a fire hydrant construction meter. Only duly authorized employees or agents of the District will be permitted to move a construction meter.

Ready-to-Serve Charge:

There will be a monthly ready-to-serve charge for construction meters of \$103.60 effective August 1, 2011, and \$108.62 effective July 1, 2012.

Commodity Charge:

The commodity charge for all water used will be at the domestic Tier 3 rate per unit as specified in Article 14, Section 80 of this Ordinance. A billing unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or 748 gallons.

<u>SECTION 7:</u> Ordinance Nos. 53 and 75, Article 9 Water Service, Section 55 Reconnection Charge is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE 9. WATER SERVICE

SECTION 55. RECONNECTION OF DELINQUENT SERVICE AND RELATED CHARGES:

Notification of Pending Lock Charge:

A charge of \$10.00 will be imposed and collected for notification, including delivery of a door hanger, of a pending lock on the meter of a delinquent account.

Lock and Unlock Charges:

A reconnection charge of \$75.00 will be imposed and collected in addition to the outstanding water bill including all late charges prior to restoring service following a disconnection for non-payment. The outstanding delinquent bill including all late charges must be paid in full prior to service being restored. If service is restored by unlocking a meter after normal business hours, a \$40 charge in addition to the \$75 dollar reconnection charge will be imposed and collected prior to restoring service. A deposit for future service may be required for delinquent accounts prior to service being restored. The amount of the deposit for future service will be determined by the General Manager or his designated representative.

Replacement of a Cut Lock:

A charge of \$35.00 will be imposed and collected to replace cut or missing locks placed to disconnect service.

Meter Removal and Replacement Charge:

A charge of \$90.00 will be imposed and collected to re-install a meter removed for repeated incidences of a cut lock.

Return Check Charge:

A charge of \$30 will be imposed and collected for the return of an unpaid check.

SECTION 8: Ordinance Nos. 49 and 75, Article 7 Services and Meters, Section 49.3 One-Day Permits is hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE 7. SERVICES AND METERS

SECTION 49.3. ONE-DAY PERMITS: One-day permits may be issued as a convenience to the applicant in lieu of a construction water meter. The fee for a one-day permit is \$35 per day. The applicant shall not use more than 10,000 gallons per day; shall keep their permit on the person using the fire hydrant during working hours; and shall provide adequate traffic fire hose protection when applicable.

SECTION 9: This Ordinance shall become effective August 1, 2011. This ordinance shall be published one (1) time in an adjudicated newspaper of general circulation within the District within 10 days of adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 207 AN ORDINANCE OF THE VALLECITOS WATER DISTRICT REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 202 AND ESTABLISHING RATES, RULES, AND **REGULATIONS FOR WATER SERVICE**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Vallecitos Water District as follows:

SECTION 1: The Board of Directors finds and determines that the following facts are true and correct:

Section 1.1: The Vallecitos Water District ("District") has the authority to establish water rates and charges for services provided within the District boundaries in accordance with Water Code Section 31024, et seq.

Section 1.2: At least 45 days prior to September 20, 2017, public notice was provided detailing the need for increases and specifying uses of revenues generated from the increase.

Section 1.3: Having heard, reviewed and considered the Cost and Rate Structure Study, approved on June 7, 2017, the staff report and information from interested persons who have had an opportunity to express their views, and being advised of the proposed changes and increases in rates, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 in favor of the proposed increases presented at the September 20, 2017 meeting and finds that it is in the best interests of the District and the customers served to approve the changes in rates contained in this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines Section 15061, the Board of Directors ordains that the water rate fees established by this ordinance are exempt from CEQA for the following reasons:

- 1. The water rates are not a "project" as defined by Guidelines Section 15378;
- 2. The project is exempt in accordance with Guidelines Section 15273(1), 15273(3), and 15274(4); and
- The activity will not have any significant effect upon the environment pursuant to 3. Guidelines Sections 15061(b) (3).

SECTION 3: The Board of Directors of the District orders and directs that the foregoing exemptions and reasons be made a part of the Notice of Exemption and that the Notice of Exemption be filed with the County Clerk of the County of San Diego.

SECTION 4. Ready-To-Serve Charge:

Section 4.1: Wholesale Fixed Charges: San Diego County Water Authority (Water Authority) is the wholesale water purveyor. The Water Authority establishes fixed monthly charges and, by District policy, these charges automatically pass through to all customers served by the District in addition to the District retail Ready-to-Serve Charge. Charges may be modified by the wholesale agencies from time to time. Significant variances in wholesale rates may cause these rates to be adjusted to accommodate the pass-through of the actual wholesale rates.

Significant modifications in wholesale rates may cause these rates to be adjusted to accommodate the pass-through of the actual wholesale rates.

<u>Section 5.2: Retail Commodity Charge:</u> In addition to the monthly retail Ready-to-Serve Charge, all water delivered through a water meter for all classes of service will be charged retail rates, in addition to the wholesale pass-through.

For customers with domestic and agricultural water combined through the same meter, the first 26 units of usage are considered domestic, therefore the \$0.94 discount does not apply to the first 26 units of use. The 2019 discount will be determined when the Water Authority adopts 2019 rates.

<u>SECTION 6:</u> This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption. This ordinance shall be published one (1) time in an adjudicated newspaper of general circulation within the District within 10 days of adoption.
