MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE FINANCE/INVESTMENT COMMITTEE OF THE VALLECITOS WATER DISTRICT MONDAY, AUGUST 31, 2020 AT 4:00 P.M. VIA TELECONFERENCE

Director Martin called the meeting to order at the hour of 4:00 p.m. The meeting was held via teleconference.

ITEM(S) FOR DISCUSSION

AFFIRMATION OF AA+ BOND RATING

Finance Manager Owen provided a brief presentation on the District's bond rating which included background information, Fitch's press release, and key rating drivers. On August 11, 2020, Fitch issued a press release announcing their affirmation of the District's AA+ bond rating with a stable outlook. This is a major accomplishment that will be important to maintain should the District need to issue debt in the future.

Staff will present this item at the September 16 Board meeting.

PUMP ZONE CHARGE REVENUE SHORTFALL ISSUE

Principal Financial Analyst Arthur facilitated a presentation, Pump Zone Analysis, as follows:

Principal Financial Analyst Arthur stated that on May 17, 2017, the Board approved a three-year increase to pump zone charges with a goal of achieving 95% revenue recovery of SDG&E's energy pass-through costs by Fiscal Year (FY) 2020/21. The pump zone charges affect approximately 3,000 customers in nine active pump zones. At the end of FY 2019/20, the revenue recovery was 61% with a shortfall of approximately \$210,000. The primary reasons for the shortfall are an approximate 25% decrease in demand over the past few years due to heavy rainfall and that approximately one third of SDG&E's costs are fixed costs.

General discussion took place.

Mike Hunsacker, member of the public, questioned whether electrical costs and pump zone charges continue to have serious impacts for agricultural customers, and why the District doesn't calculate the electrical costs for the pump zone charges per kilowatt hour. General Manager Pruim explained that the District's calculation is a blend of fixed and variable SDG&E costs.

AWARD OF FINANCIAL REPORTING ACHIEVEMENT

Finance Manager Owen stated that last year the District expanded its basic financial statements to a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). He discussed the three sections that make up the CAFR, introductory, financial, and statistical, the information provided in each section, and the CAFR preparation process. Staff submitted the CAFR to the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) in December of 2019 for the financial reporting award, and this month the GFOA awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to the District for its CAFR for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2019.

COST OF SERVICE STUDY UPDATE

General Manager Pruim provided an update on the Cost of Service Study (COSS). He stated the FY 2020/21 budget adopted in June assumes on the revenue aspect that a rate increase of approximately 3.5% would go into effect on February 1, 2021. The COSS does not determine the overall revenue requirements or revenue increase; it determines how to allocate revenue requirements among the District's customer base.

General Manager Pruim stated that several months ago the Board awarded a contract to Raftelis to perform the COSS. Staff has been meeting with Raftelis to start the process and recommends the Board hold a workshop meeting on September 9 to determine the Board's priorities and fundamental issues to look at in the COSS. Raftelis will need two months to work on data based on the Board's input before presenting their preliminary results to the Board in mid-November. At a November meeting the Board will be asked for their feedback and to select one of several alternatives to complete the COSS. The tentative timeline suggests that at the December 2 Board meeting, the Board will be asked to 1) consider proposed rates that are consistent with revenue requirements and the Board's overall objectives; 2) approve the COSS; 3) approve preliminary rates for Proposition 218 noticing purposes only; and 4) set the date for a

public hearing. Staff recommends the public hearing be held on January 20, 2021 at a regularly scheduled Board meeting. According to the tentative timeline, the Proposition 218 notice would be mailed out to customers on December 4 which initiates the required 45-day notice period. If the Board adopts new rates on January 20, 2021, the rates will be effective on February 1, 2021 and will be reflected in the March 1, 2021 customer bills.

General Manager Pruim further stated staff is working with Raftelis to determine if the tentative timeline is achievable. If the target date of February 1, 2021 for the rate increase is not met, the result will be a \$50,000 per month loss of revenue over what was assumed in the budget process. If rates were adopted one or two months later, the rate increase may have to be higher to achieve the same revenue requirements, or the loss of revenue would be realized and adjusted in the budget. An alternative would be to conduct the public hearing at a Special Board meeting on January 27, 2021 which would still make the February 1 effective date possible.

General discussion took place regarding the tentative timeline for the proposed rate increase.

FY 2019/2020 YEAR END CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM SUMMARY

Capital Facilities Senior Engineer Morgan briefly demonstrated how information pertaining to active Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects may be accessed on the District's website.

Capital Facilities Senior Engineer Morgan provided a presentation on Capital Projects – 2019/2020 Fourth Quarter Update and 2019/2020 End of the Year Report as follows:

Capital Facilities Senior Engineer Morgan stated the total for active construction projects in Fiscal Year (FY) 2019/2020 was \$4,138,192 of which \$4,084,621 has been paid to date. There were a total of 49 change orders averaging 6.62%; however, removing two change orders that were initiated by staff lowered that percentage to 1.75%. The change orders on projects completed in FY 2019/2020 resulted in an actual budget surplus of \$686,373. Design contracts totaled \$1,317,937.

General discussion took place.

This item was presented for information only.

HIGH POINT PIPE ASSESSMENT

District Engineer Gumpel stated the High Point Country Manor development was initiated in the mid-2000's. In 2007 a pump station and associated facilities as well as pipelines

were constructed and nearly ready for acceptance by the District; however, the project was abandoned and the facilities were never accepted by the District. Several developers have come forward since then expressing interest in developing the project. The District has maintained its position recommending that the pump station and its facilities and all of the pipelines be replaced. The current developer of the property approached the District about performing a pipeline condition assessment. The assessment does not address the pump station and associated pumps, motors, gearing and generator. The District maintains its position that those items will need to be replaced and will be addressed at a later date.

Asset Management Supervisor Bowman facilitated a presentation, "High Point Pipeline Condition Assessment Results and Recommendations," as follows:

Asset Management Supervisor Bowman stated that during the internal pipeline inspection, approximately 2,059 linear feet of 12-inch ductile iron pipe was inspected in the Woodland Heights Glen area of the project. Potholing was also performed in two locations. Approximately 706 linear feet of 8-inch ductile iron pipeline was inspected in the Kensington Glen area.

Asset Management Supervisor Bowman discussed the findings of the assessment. In the Woodland Heights Glen area, the results indicated significant loss of wall thickness and significant deterioration as well as corrosion that was further verified by the potholing. Staff recommended replacement of all 12-inch pipeline with the same trench and reusing existing bedding and appurtenances. Regarding the Kensington Glen area, the results indicated minimal loss of wall thickness, the sections of pipe that were potholed showed no corrosion, and the pipeline is in relatively "like new" condition. Staff recommended PICA inspection of the remaining 8-inch pipe within the development to determine the condition of that pipe. The Technical Memorandum – Summary of High Point Pipeline Condition Assessment Draft Report is available on the District's website.

General discussion took place.

MOTION WAS MADE by Director Elitharp, seconded by President Evans, and carried unanimously, to approve staff's recommendation to replace all of the 12-inch ductile iron pipeline within the development and inspect the remaining unexamined 8-inch ductile iron pipeline within the development to determine the condition of that pipe.

REPORTS

GENERAL MANAGER

General Manager Pruim reported the following:

- Governor Newsom recently introduced two new COVID-19 classification criteria. One is based on the number of new confirmed cases per 100,000 of population and the other is the percentage of administered tests that came back positive for COVID-19. The criteria results in four tiers or risk levels that determine which businesses may open and what restrictions they may have. Tier 1 (purple) is the worst and considers the COVID-19 threat wide spread; Tier 2 (red) considers the threat substantial; Tier 3 (orange) considers the threat moderate; and Tier 4 (yellow) considers the threat minimal. It appears that the COVID-19 metrics are trending in a positive direction locally. San Diego County has been placed in Tier 2 with substantial risk. Some businesses such as restaurants have been allowed to reopen this week with fewer restrictions; however, there are still restrictions in place that limit the District's ability to resume normal operations. The District's field operations staff have been back to work for some time now. A significant number of administrative staff are continuing to telecommute. The Tier 2 risk level calls for continued telecommuting. When San Diego County enters Tier 3, plans will be developed concerning the telecommuting staff. The District's lobby will remain closed to the public and public meetings will continue to be conducted via Zoom for the foreseeable future.
- The District's annual Water Academy is usually held in October. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, staff does not recommend holding the event this year. Staff is looking into ways of offering a virtual option and possibly rescheduling the event in the future when the COVID-19 related restrictions are relaxed.

DISTRICT LEGAL COUNSEL

Legal Counsel Gilpin discussed Assembly Bill 992 relative to the Brown Act and serial meetings via cell phones, texts and social media. If the bill passes, it would create an exception under the Brown Act that would allow elected officials to engage in separate conversations outside of a meeting on an Internet based social media platform to answer questions, provide information to the public, or solicit information from the public regarding District business.

SAN DIEGO COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

General Manager Pruim stated he and President Evans attended the SDCWA Board meeting on August 27 at which the Regional Conveyance System (RCS) project was discussed at length. As directed by the VWD Board, General Manager Pruim submitted a letter to the SDCWA Board on August 26 opposing the project unless it was delayed. The letter was included in the public record. The SDCWA Board received over 500 letters regarding the RCS from the public. Most of the letters received opposed the project. A vast majority of the opposition letters were automatically generated from a link that was provided on an environmental group's website.

General Manager Pruim further stated the SDCWA Board voted to defer the item until their November Board meeting, and authorized additional funding up to \$200,000 for SDCWA staff to continue to work with member agencies, consultants and environmental groups that are opposing the project to better prepare for the November meeting.

ENCINA WASTEWATER AUTHORITY

Director Hernandez stated the Capital Improvement Committee meeting has not met since the last Board meeting.

Director Martin stated the Policy and Finance Committee has not met since the last Board meeting.

Vice President Sannella stated the Finance/Investment Committee met on August 31 at which the Committee discussed the Cost of Service Study.

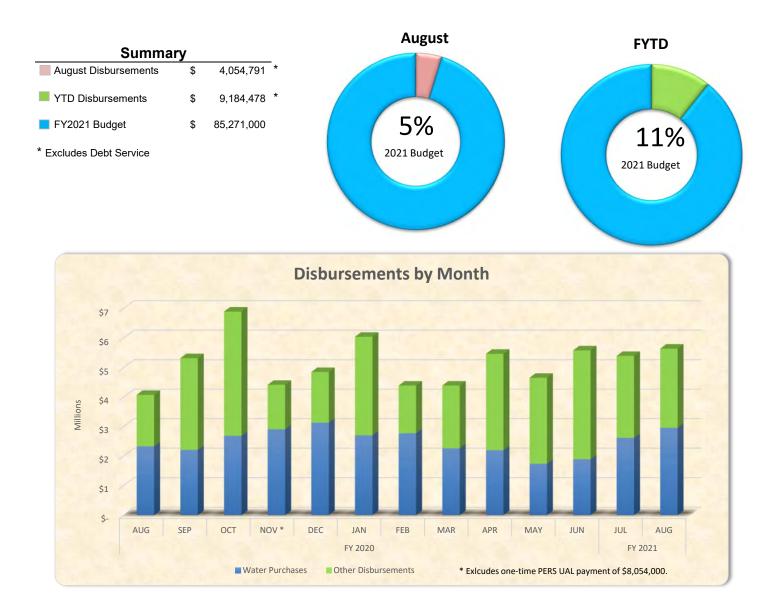

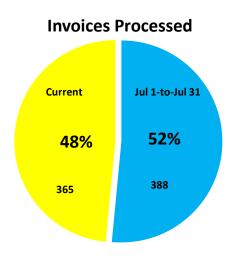

VALLECITOS WATER DISTRICT DISBURSEMENTS SUMMARY August 31, 2020







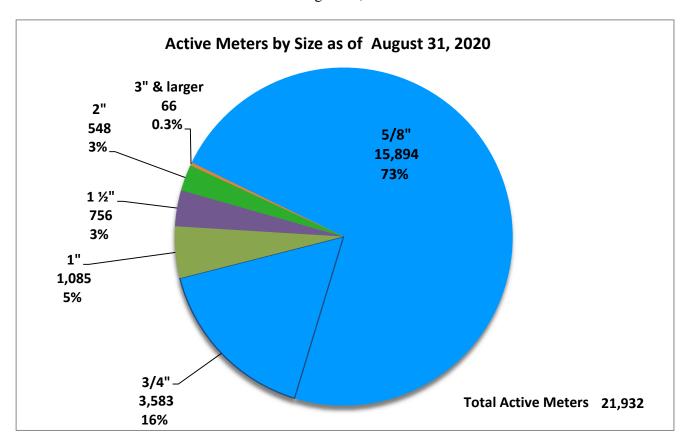

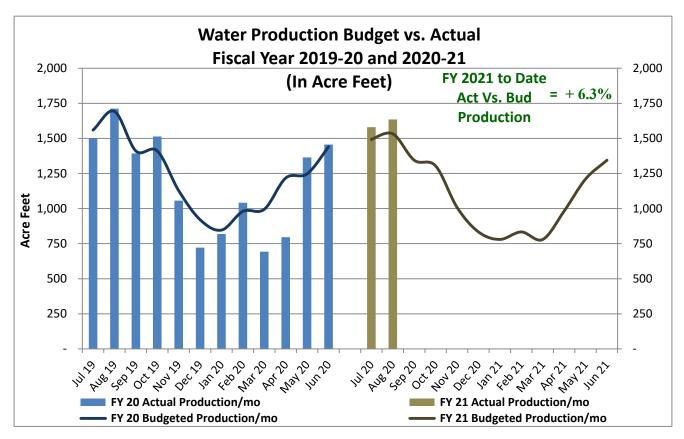
Vallecitos Water District Active Water Meters August 31, 2020

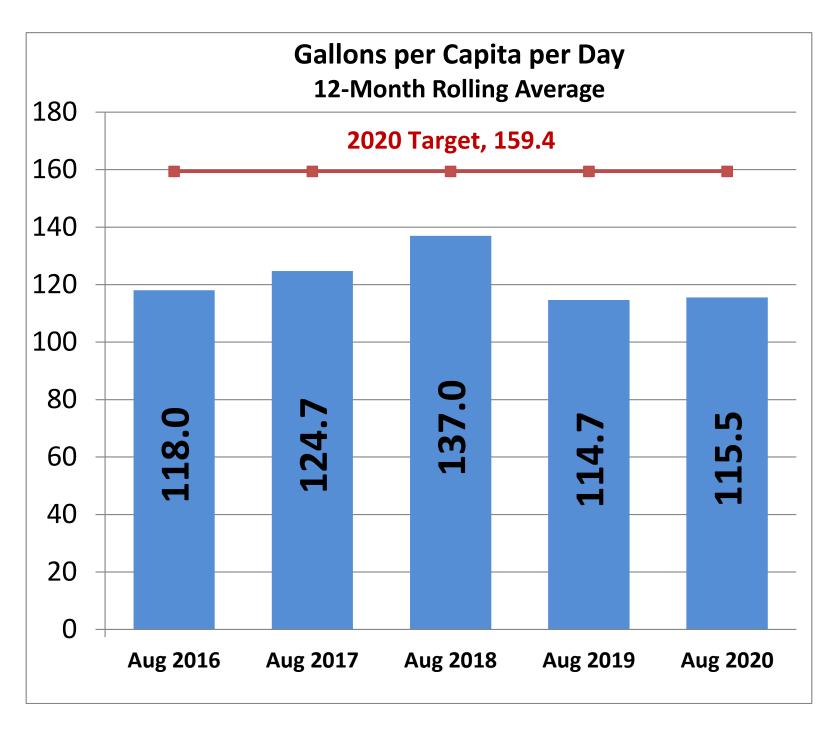




Vallecitos Water District Water Production/Sales August 31, 2020

SUBJECT: MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORTS

BACKGROUND:

The Monthly Revenue and Expense Reports and the Reserve Report for the two months ended August 31, 2020 are presented.

DISCUSSION:

The Monthly Revenue and Expense reports summarize revenues by service type and expenses by department over the 2-month period. Comparisons to prior year actual and current year budget amounts are also presented. Each statement contains footnotes regarding significant variances exceeding predetermined dollar and percentage amounts. Any excess of revenues over expenses are transferred to reserves and reflected in the Reserve Report. Any excess of expenses above revenues are paid for out of reserves in the current fiscal year.

The Monthly Reserve Report presents the balances in each of the District's reserve funds. The report summarizes all sources and uses of reserves. Sources consist of operating transfers, capital facility fees, property taxes, dissolved RDA distributions, investment earnings and annexation fees. Uses are distributions for capital projects and debt service.

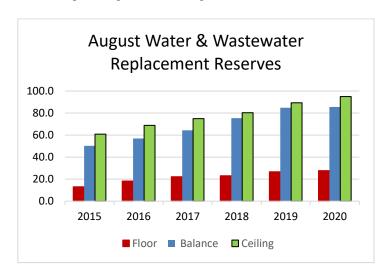

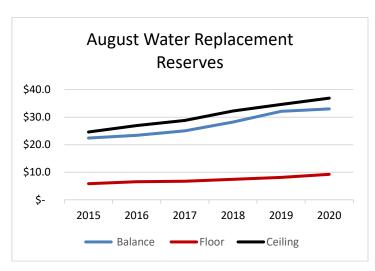
REPLACEMENT RESERVES

The District maintains two replacement reserves in cash equivalents and investments: One for the District's water system, and the other for the District's wastewater system. The District's reserve policy establishes a floor of the sum of the next three years of projected system replacement costs, and a ceiling of the sum of the next ten years of system replacement costs. As of August 31, 2020, the total water and wastewater replacement reserve balance was \$85.5 million, 1 percent greater than August 31, 2019.



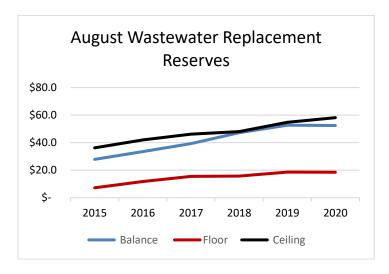
WATER REPLACEMENT RESERVE

As of August 31, 2020, the District's water replacement reserve totaled \$33.0 million, an increase of 2.8 percent, or \$0.9 million, from the same month of the prior year. The month-end balance is within the floor and ceiling established by the reserve policy, leaving the District with sufficient reserves to meet infrastructure replacement needs.



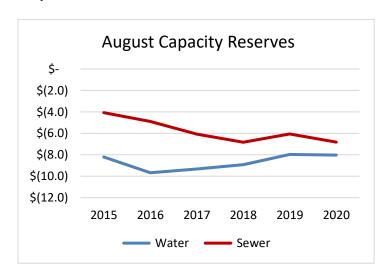
WASTEWATER REPLACEMENT RESERVE

As of August 31, 2020, the balance in the District's wastewater replacement reserve totaled \$52.5 million, a decrease of 0.34 percent, or \$0.2 million, from the same month of the prior year. The month-end balance is within the approved floor and ceiling.



CAPACITY RESERVES

The District collects capital facility fees from new development and increased demands from existing customers, maintains the collected fees in separate funds (one for water and one for wastewater), and uses the funds exclusively to provide capacity to serve new development and fund future construction of facilities identified in the District's Master Plan and capital budget. As of August 31, 2020, the water capacity fund had a deficit of \$8.0 million and the sewer capacity fund had a deficit of \$6.8 million. The District's capital facility fees situation is expected to improve with the adoption of the new Master Plan and the corresponding capacity fee study.

Attached is a detailed list of investments for all District funds that are not needed to meet current obligations. In accordance with Government Code Section 53646, the information is presented to the Board on a monthly basis and includes a breakdown by fund, financial institution, settlement and maturity date, yield, and investment amount. In addition, the report indicates the various percentages of investments in each type of institution.

The process and the presentation of the information to the Board are in compliance with requirements outlined in the District Investment Policy adopted on an annual basis. In addition to the investment portfolio, there are sufficient funds in the Operating Account to meet District obligations for the next 30 days. Maturity dates on investments are structured to meet the future financial obligations of the District (i.e., bond payments and construction projections). In that regard, the District will be able to meet expenditure requirements for the next six months without a need to liquidate an investment earlier than scheduled maturity dates.

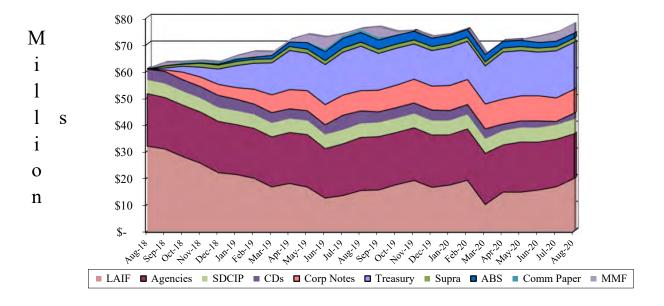

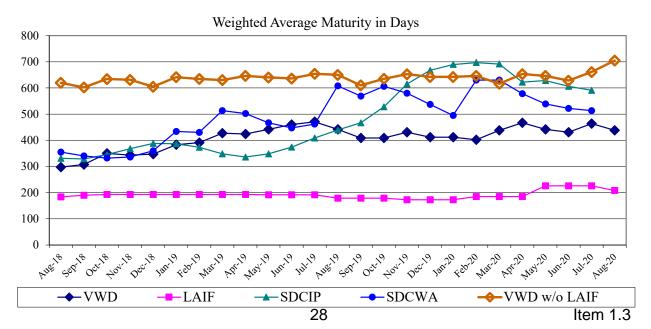
Safety

Criteria for selecting investments and the absolute order of priority are safety, liquidity and yield. To meet the objective of safety and avert credit risk, the District acquires only those investments permitted by the Board adopted investment policy and within the limits established by the policy. Credit risk is the risk that an issuer or other counter party to an investment will not fulfill its obligation. The District also limits risk by investing in a range of investments to ensure diversification as indicated in the graph below.



Liquidity

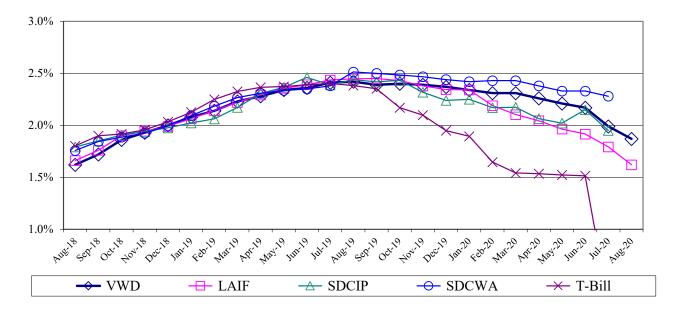
Interest rate risk is the risk that changes in interest rates will adversely affect the fair value of investments. The District averts interest rate risk by limiting terms of investments in accordance with the Investment Policy. Maturity in days is a measure of liquidity. The next graph compares the District's liquidity to other managed portfolios. The District's liquidity is graphed with and without LAIF. With LAIF the District is in fact very liquid with \$16.0 million available the same day. But for comparative purposes LAIF is eliminated from the District's portfolio and shown separately.

Investment/Debt Management

On March 7, 2018 the District entered into a contract with Chandler Asset Management to provide professional investment management and advisory services. Chandler manages the District's investments in accordance with the District's policy of safety, liquidity, and yield and continues to maintain investments of varying types within limits allowed by the investment policy (100% in federal agency obligations, 100% in LAIF, 100% in other local government investment pools, 25% in FDIC-backed corporate notes, 25% in commercial paper, 20% in certificates of deposit). 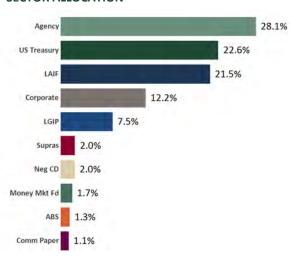

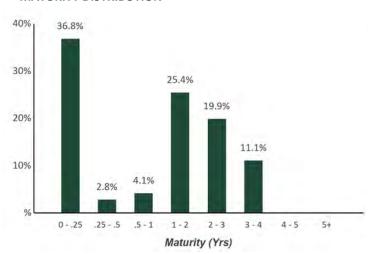

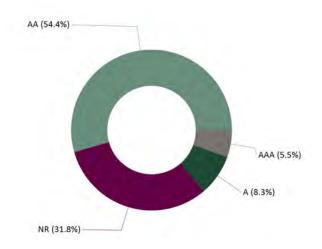
SECTOR ALLOCATION

BACKGROUND:

The Lupa property consists of two adjacent parcels totaling approximately 2.33 acres located on Anthony Heights Drive east of Nordahl Road and north of Rock Springs Road (APN 228-010-24 & 25) in the City of Escondido. Both parcels are outside of the Vallecitos Water District water service boundary and APN 228-010-24 is within VWD's sewer service area. Both parcels are within Vista Irrigation District's (VID) service boundary.

DISCUSSION:

Richard Lupa requested annexation of APN 228-010-25 into the District's sewer service area in December 2019. The District's conditions for annexation were approved at the February 5, 2020 Board of Directors meeting. VID will continue to provide water service. Detachment from VID is not required.

The property owner has paid \$13,059.90 in sewer annexation fees in accordance with Ordinance No. 200. He has also paid \$350 in State Board of Equalization fees per the conditions of annexation listed in the February 5, 2020 staff report.

FISCAL IMPACT:

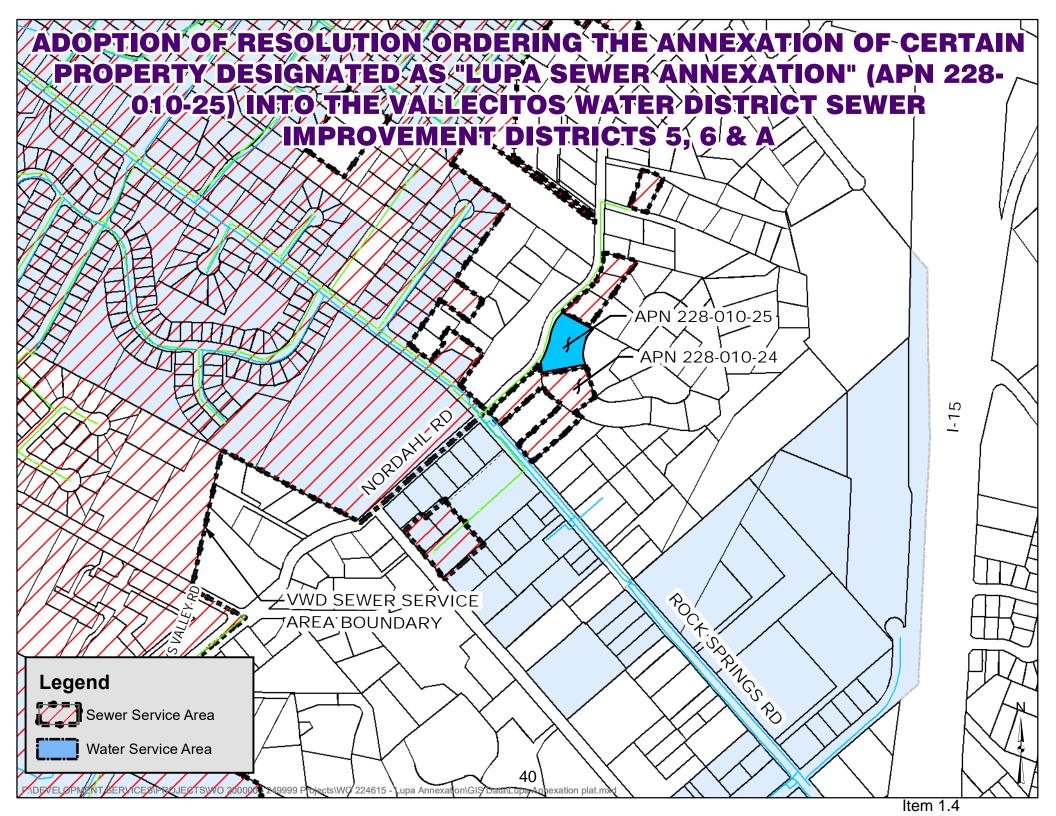

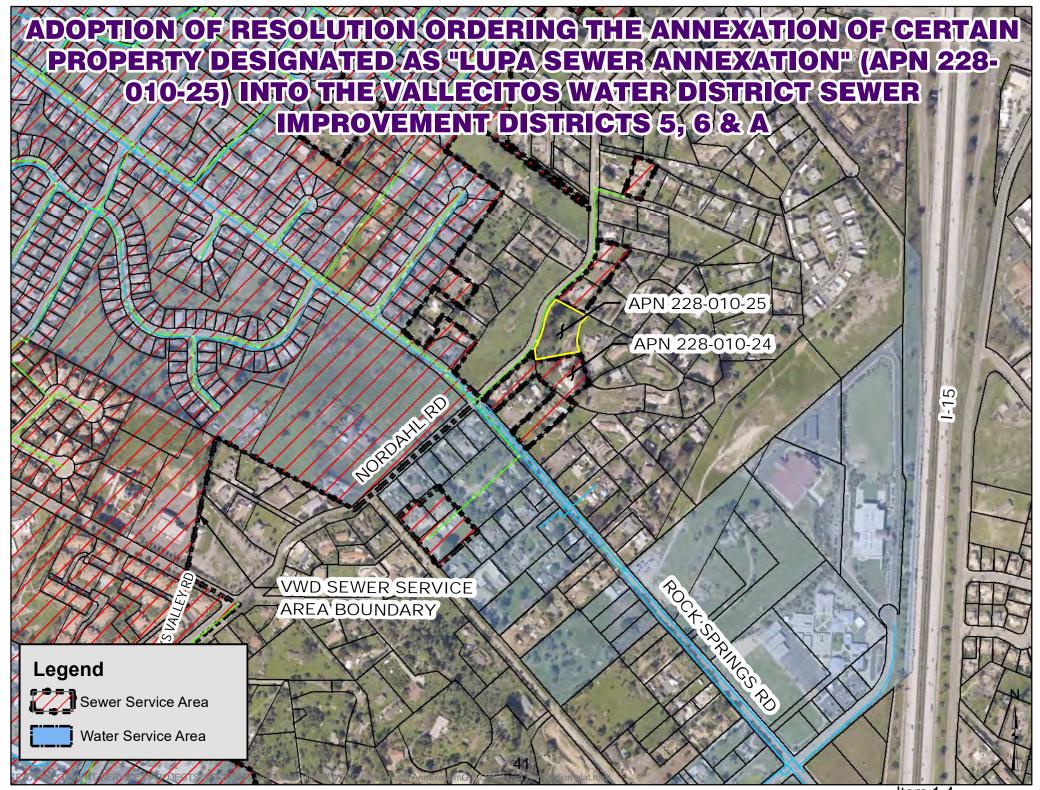

SECTION 1: The following facts are hereby found and determined to be true:

- Section 1.1: That the Vallecitos Water District owns, operates, and maintains a sewage disposal system under and by virtue of Sewer Improvement Districts 5, 6 & A of the Vallecitos Water District.
- Section 1.2: That the owners of the land described in this resolution, consisting of approximately 1.35 acres, and also referred to as APN 228-010-25, have given their written consent to the annexation of said lands to the Sewer Improvement Districts hereinafter designated and have, in writing, requested the annexation of said lands to said Sewer Improvement Districts.
- <u>Section 1.3:</u> That the owners of the land described in this resolution have advanced to the Secretary of the Vallecitos Water District the costs of this annexation, including, but not limited to, advertising, engineering and attorney's fees.
- <u>Section 1.4:</u> The inclusion of said land within the designated Sewer Improvement Districts will be for the best interest of the designated Sewer Improvement Districts.
- <u>Section 1.5:</u> The inclusion of said land within said Sewer Improvement Districts will be for the best interest of the land, and the owners thereof consent to the inclusion of said land in the designated Sewer Improvement Districts of the Vallecitos Water District.
- Section 1.6: The Board of Directors determines that all the land hereinafter described shall be included in the designated Sewer Improvement Districts; that the proceedings had for the annexation and inclusion herein and above referred to were genuine and sufficient and in all respects complied with the Water Code of the State of California commencing at Section 32550.
- <u>Section 1.7:</u> That the land herein described was previously not within the boundaries of the Vallecitos Water District and said lands are not a part of an Improvement District constituted for a purpose similar to the purpose of Improvement Districts 5, 6 & A of the Vallecitos Water District.
- <u>SECTION 2:</u> The Board of Directors of the Vallecitos Water District does hereby order the annexation of all the lands hereinafter described to Sewer Improvement Districts 5, 6 & A of the Vallecitos Water District pursuant to this resolution and the proceedings above referred to, which description contained in Exhibits "A" & "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof, is sufficient to identify the land.

<u>SECTION 3:</u> The condition of said annexation to Vallecitos Water District and Sewer Improvement District 5 of the Vallecitos Water District are as follows:

Section 3.1: Payment by petitioners of the sum of \$9,674.00 per acre or fraction thereof for annexation of the territory into Sewer Improvement Districts 5, 6 & A for the use or right of use of the existing property in the Improvement Districts.

Section 3.2: Payment by the petitioners of the sum of \$1,000.00 to cover costs of annexation, which includes attorney fees, publication, filing fees and miscellaneous costs of annexation.

<u>Section 3.3:</u> The lands annexed to an Vallecitos Water District and Sewer Improvement Districts 5 shall be subject to existing bond issues and indebtedness of the Improvement District from and after the filing with the San Diego County Assessor of a certified copy of this resolution as set forth in Section 32553 of the Water Code of the State of California.

SECTION 4: This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its final passage; this resolution being adopted pursuant to Section 32552 of the Water Code of the State of California. This resolution being adopted without notice and hearing and without an election being conducted in said territory, all in accordance with Section 32552 of the Water Code of the State of California. The Secretary of this District shall comply with the provisions of the Water Code, Section 32553, and shall file a certified copy of this resolution together with a map of the territory thus annexed with the San Diego County Assessor and the San Diego County Tax Collector and with the State Board of Equalization.

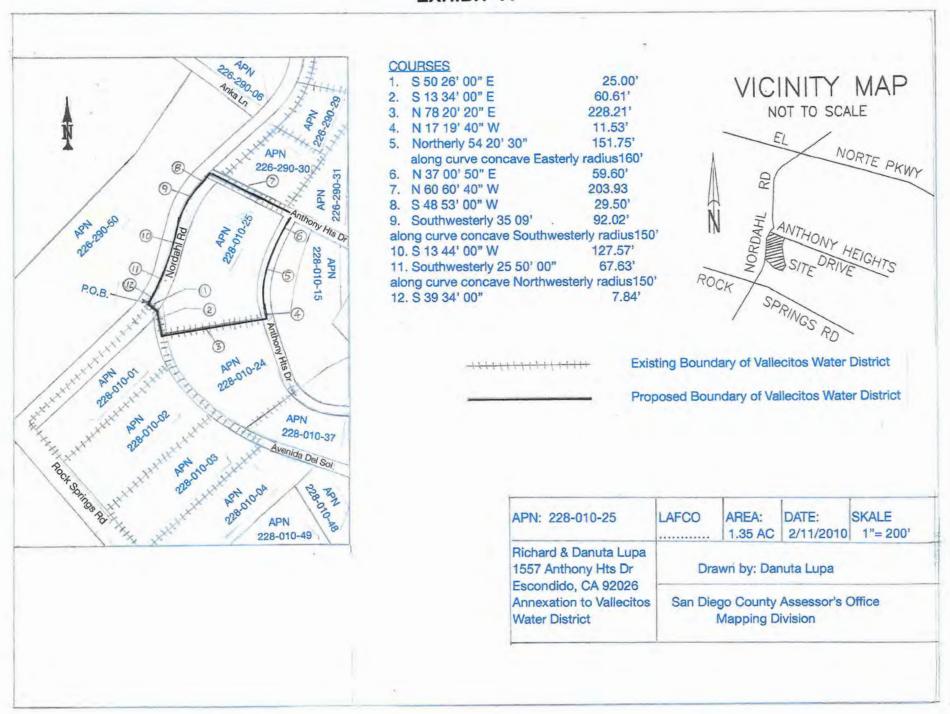

SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY WATER

AUTHORITY FOR THE VALLECITOS 11 FLOW CONTROL FACILITY

DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

BACKGROUND:

The District has five existing connections to the San Diego County Water Authority's (SDCWA's) infrastructure. One of these connections, the Vallecitos 2 Flow Control Facility, is to SDCWA's first aqueduct system in Escondido. This connection is within a SDCWA easement on a property north of Rincon Avenue and east of N. Broadway. The property is owned by the City of Escondido.

DISCUSSION:

The SDCWA is replacing the Vallecitos 2 Flow Control Facility, which was constructed in 1958, with a new Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility that will have the same capacity (12 cubic feet per second). As with the existing Vallecitos 2 Flow Control Facility, the new Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility will be owned by the SDCWA.

On November 6, 2019, the Board of Directors approved a Joint Use Agreement with the SDCWA and the City of Escondido to grant VWD rights to access the pipeline connection point to the existing Vallecitos 2 Flow Control Facility. This same connection point will be utilized for the new Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility.

The SDCWA has drafted an Agreement for the design, construction, operation and maintenance of the new Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility connection, which details the responsibilities of both parties. According to the agreement, the SDCWA will design and construct the new facility while VWD will provide timely feedback on design submittals and construction changes, and assist with isolating its water system from the SDCWA first aqueduct during the connection transfer to the new flow control facility.

Staff and legal counsel have reviewed the Agreement. There is no cost to VWD for the design, construction, operation or maintenance of the new Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility.

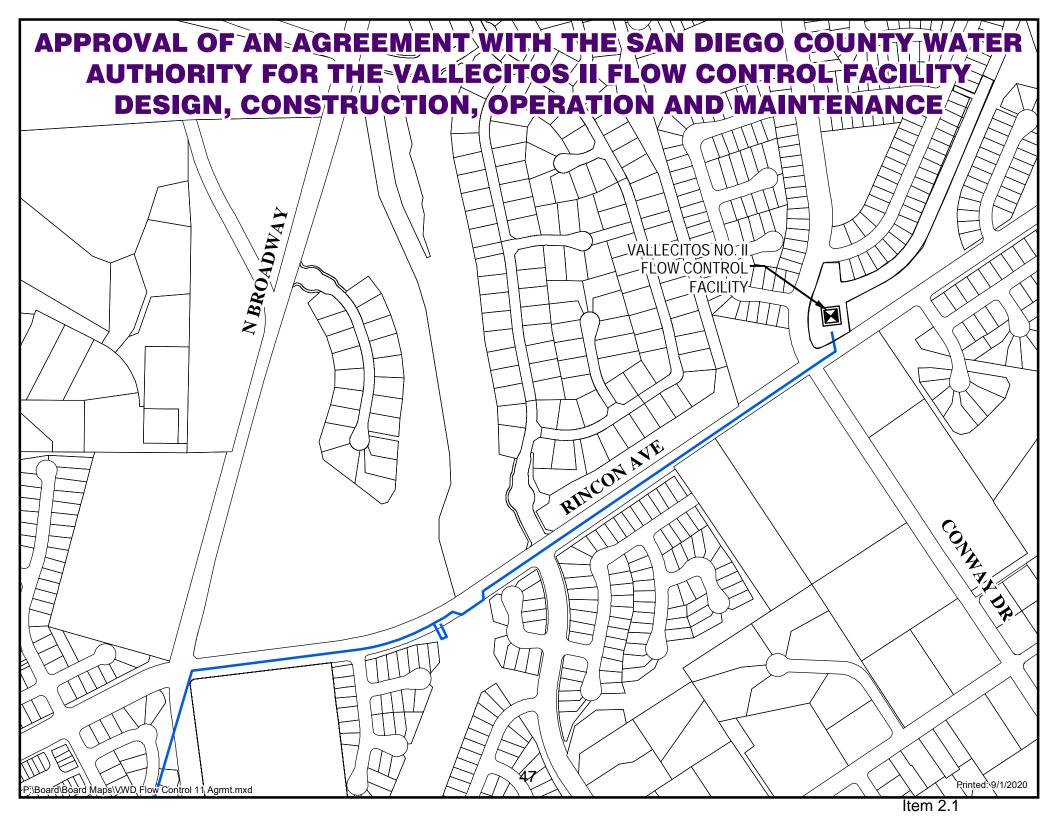

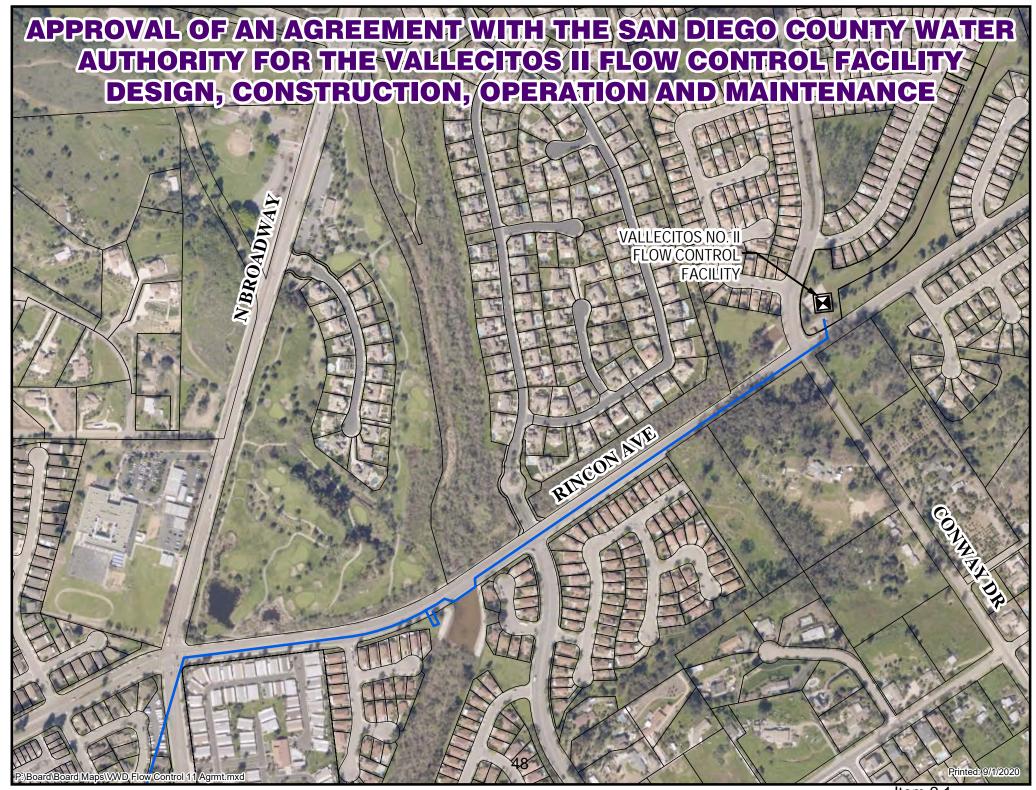

Agreement between San Diego County Water Authority and Vallecitos Water District for Design, Construction, Ownership, Operation, and Maintenance of the Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility

This Agreement is entered into as of	, 2020, between the
San Diego County Water Authority, a county water authority	(Water Authority) and
Vallecitos Water District, a county water district (Vallecitos)	. The Water Authority and
Vallecitos (collectively Parties) in consideration of their mutu	al covenants, and for other
valuable consideration, agree as follows:	

Recitals:

- A. Vallecitos is a member agency of the Water Authority and currently distributes and sells at retail to its customers treated water supplied by the Water Authority.
- B. The Water Authority established an Asset Management Program (Program) in 2009 to prioritize the rehabilitation, repair, or replacement of assets based on consequence of failure and probability of failure.
- C. The purpose of this Agreement is for the Water Authority to construct a new Vallecitos 11 Flow Control Facility (VAL11 FCF) to replace the Vallecitos 2 Flow Control Facility (VAL 2 FCF), which was constructed in 1958.
- D. The Water Authority currently meters and controls the delivery of up to 7.8 million gallons per day (mgd), or 12 cubic feet per second (cfs), of treated water from Pipeline 1 and Pipeline 2 to the existing VAL 2 FCF. Vallecitos has requested the delivery capacity remain unchanged for VAL11 FCF. As a result, VAL11 FCF will be designed and constructed to deliver 7.8 mgd (12 cfs) of treated water from Pipeline 1 and Pipeline 2.
 - F. There is no existing written agreement between the Parties for VAL 2 FCF. Therefore, this Agreement establishes the terms and conditions pursuant to which the existing VAL 2 FCF will be replaced by VAL11 FCF, at the same location with a new permanently metered 7.8 mgd (12 cfs) treated water flow control facility, which will be designed, constructed, owned, operated, and maintained by the Water Authority.
 - G. VAL11 FCF will share the location with another new facility for Vista Irrigation District to be called Vista Irrigation District 12 Flow Control Facility (VID12 FCF). VAL11 FCF and VID12 FCF will be housed in a single building and will be referred as to VAL11/VID12 FCF. VAL11/VID 12 FCF will be designed and constructed concurrently. The Water Authority and Vista Irrigation District have a separate design, construction, ownership, operation, and maintenance agreement for VID12 FCF.

H. The Water Authority is the lead agency for environmental documents and will ensure the work performed under this Agreement complies with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). A Notice of Exemption was filed on December 15, 2016 for this project, therefore CEQA requirements have been completed and approved.

The Recitals are incorporated herein and the Parties agree as follows:

1.0 Delivery of Water to Vallecitos 11 FCF

1.1 Availability, delivery, rate of flow, and cost of treated water to be sold by the Water Authority to Vallecitos shall be as established by the Board of Directors of the Water Authority in accordance with the Water Authority's Administrative Code, on the same basis as generally applicable to the Water Authority's member agencies.

2.0 Facility Design and Construction

- 2.1 Water Authority will design and construct VAL11 FCF to its standards with a capacity to deliver up to 7.8 mgd (12 cfs) of treated water to Vallecitos.
- 2.2 VAL11 FCF will be combined with VID12 FCF in a single building.

3.0 Facility and Access Right-of-Way

- 3.1 VAL 11 FCF will be located on Water Authority right of way immediately adjacent to the existing VAL 2 FCF as shown on Exhibit A, attached and made a part of this Agreement. The property is currently owned in fee by City of Escondido. Facility access will be from adjacent public streets.
- 3.2 The Water Authority will acquire temporary construction easements and all other property rights it deems necessary for VAL 11/VID12 FCF prior to the start of construction activities.
- 3.3 The Water Authority has negotiated the Joint Use Agreement #2018-111, as shown in Exhibit B, attached and made a part of this Agreement, for the necessary property rights from the City of Escondido for Vallecitos's portion of the 16-inch-diameter pipeline.

4.0 <u>Vallecitos Will Perform the Following</u>

4.1 Assign a project manager for the VAL11 FCF who will be the Water Authority's single point of contact.

- 4.2 Review and comment on the 70% and 100% design plans and construction documents related to the connection to the existing Vallecitos distribution pipeline. During the design phase, Vallecitos will submit review comments and concurrence within 15 working days. During the construction phase, Vallecitos will submit review comments and concurrence within five calendar days of receipt of a construction submittal. If Vallecitos does not respond within the allotted time, it will be understood by the Parties that no Vallecitos comment is required. Vallecitos shall not unreasonably delay or withhold concurrence.
- 4.3 Shutdown, isolate and drain the existing distribution pipe(s) downstream of VAL 2 FCF at the same time as the Water Authority's aqueduct shutdowns, to allow the Water Authority to complete the connection for VAL 11 FCF.
- 4.4 All work performed and all material used (including cost of water drained) by Vallecitos will be done so at its own expense.

5.0 The Water Authority Will Perform the Following

- 5.1 Assign a project manager for the VAL 11 FCF who will be Vallecitos' single point of contact.
- 5.2 Procure or provide services for preliminary design, final design, a public bid, preparation of addendum and change orders, inspection and testing services, and construction of VAL 11 FCF. Each contract shall require the contractor to obtain and maintain insurance policies. All such insurance policies shall name Vallecitos, including its directors, officers, employees and agents, as additional insureds.
- 5.3 Vallecitos' point of delivery at the existing VAL 2 FCF will be maintained during construction of the VAL11/VID12 FCF, except for the aqueduct shutdown as described below:
 - 5.3.1 Shutdown: A 12-day aqueduct shutdown is required for the replacement of and connection to the turnouts for VAL 11/VID12 FCF. During this shutdown, the following work will be performed: replace valves and piping at both the turnout structures on Pipeline 1 and Pipeline 2, complete the rehabilitation structural elements, and connect VAL11/VID 12 FCF to Pipeline 1 and Pipeline 2 on the upstream side of the VAL11/VID12 FCF and Vallecitos' system on the downstream side of the VAL11/VID12 FCF. Once the connections are complete, the point of delivery for Vallecitos will be via VAL11 FCF. To make the above permanent connections and tie-ins, the existing distribution pipe(s), owned and operated by Vallecitos, downstream of VAL 2 FCF, will need to be shut down at the same time as the Water Authority's aqueduct shutdowns.

- 5.4 Coordinate and provide to Vallecitos 30 days notice of the 12 day shutdown.
- 5.5 Upon request, the Water Authority will provide to Vallecitos electronic record drawings in pdf format showing the connection between VAL 11 FCF and Vallecitos' distribution pipeline.

6.0 Ownership and Operational Control of Facilities

- 6.1 The Water Authority will own, maintain, and operate all components of VAL 11 FCF, including inlet and outlet piping, as shown on Exhibit A. On the outlet piping, a cathodic protection isolation joint assembly will be installed to delineate the change in ownership, as shown on Exhibit A. On the surface, the change of ownership will be delineated with a concrete pad. The Water Authority will own and maintain the piping and equipment up to and including the cathodic protection isolation joint and test station, as shown on Exhibit A. Vallecitos will own and maintain the piping and equipment downstream of the cathodic protection isolation joint.
- 6.2 In accordance with current Water Authority Board policy, all operation and maintenance costs of the VAL11 FCF shall be borne by the Water Authority.
- 7.0 Cost Responsibility: The Water Authority will pay all costs related to the design, construction, operation, and maintenance of VAL 11 FCF, except as stated in Paragraph 4.

8.0 Non-Binding Mediation

- 8.1 If a dispute arises out of, or relates to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, and if the dispute cannot be settled through normal contract negotiations, the Parties agree to first try to settle the dispute using mediation under the Construction Industry Mediation Rules of the American Arbitration Association or any other neutral organization agreed upon before having recourse in a court of law.
- 8.2 The expenses of witnesses for either side shall be paid by the party producing such witnesses. All other expenses of the mediation, including required traveling and other expenses of the mediator, and the cost of any proofs or expert advice produced at the direct request of the mediator, shall be borne equally by the Parties, unless otherwise agreed.
- 8.3 Any agreements resulting from mediation shall be documented in writing. All mediation results and documentation, by themselves, shall be "non-binding." Mediators shall not be subject to any subpoena or liability and their actions shall not be subject to discovery.
- 9.0 <u>Mutual Indemnification</u>: Vallecitos and Water Authority agree to mutually indemnify, defend at their own expense, including attorneys' fees, and hold each

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other harmless from and against all claims, costs, demands, losses, and liability of any nature whatsoever, including but not limited to liability for bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, property damage (including loss of use), or violation of the law, caused by or arising out of any error, omission, negligent act, or willful misconduct of that party, its officers, directors, employees, agents, volunteers, or any other person acting pursuant to its control in performing under this Agreement.

- 10.0 <u>Laws and Venue</u>. This Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. If any action is brought to interpret or enforce any term of this Agreement, the action shall be brought in a state or federal court in San Diego County.
- 11.0 <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be modified only by a subsequent written amendment executed by both Parties.
- 12.0 <u>Term;</u> The term of this Agreement shall begin on the date first written above and shall continue in full force and effect until terminated by mutual written agreement of the Parties.
- 13.0 <u>Successors or Assigns</u>. This Agreement and any portion thereof shall not be assigned or transferred, nor shall any of the duties be delegated, without the express written consent of both Parties, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Any attempt to assign or delegate this Agreement without the express written consent of both Parties shall be void and of no force or effect.
- 14.0 <u>Notices.</u> Any notice or instrument required to be given or delivered by this Agreement may be given or delivered by depositing the same in any United States Post Office, postage prepaid, addressed to:

- 15.0 <u>Severability.</u> The partial or total invalidity of one or more parts of this Agreement will not affect the intent or validity of this entire Agreement.
- 16.0 <u>Signatures.</u> The individuals executing this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the legal capacity and authority to do so on behalf of their respective legal entities. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts and

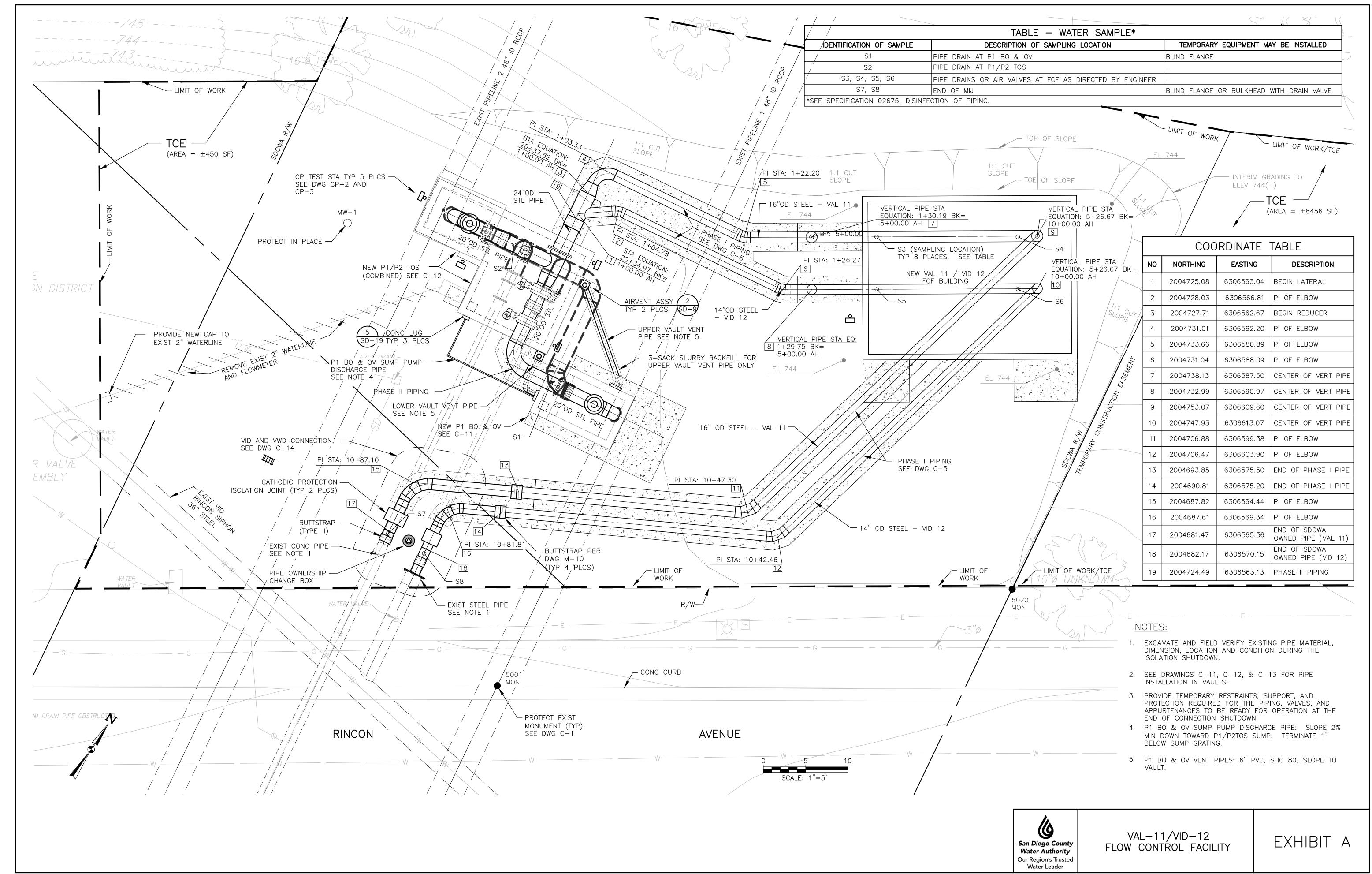

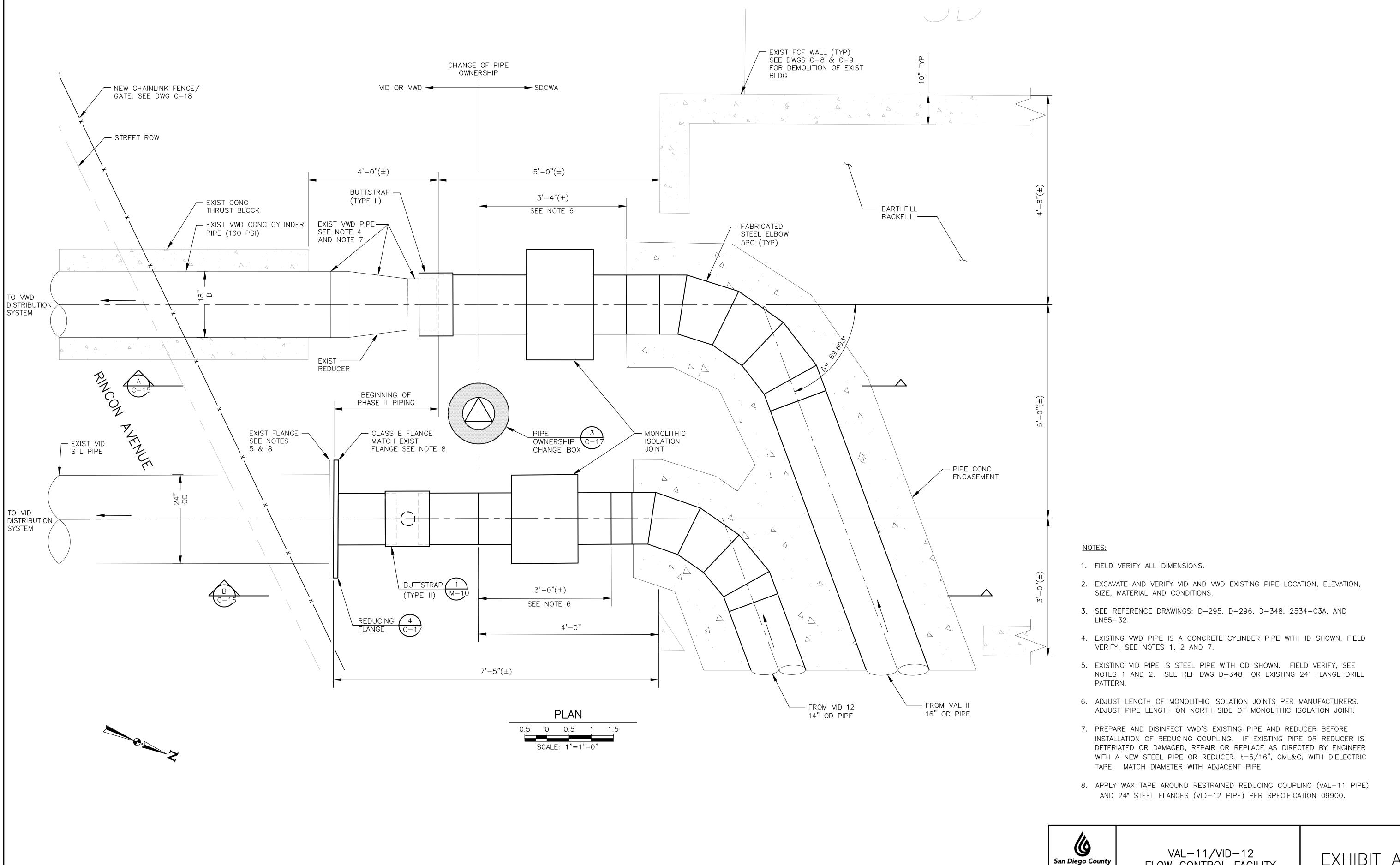

JOINT USE AGREEMENT # 2018-111 BETWEEN VALLECITOS WATER DISTRICT AND THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

- A. City is the owner of the property identified as APN 224-985-51.
- B. The Water Authority has an easement for pipeline and other facilities located in, upon, over, under, and across this property acquired by Quitclaim Deed recorded December 19, 1997 as Document 1997-0646794 of the official records of the County of San Diego, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference "the Water Authority's Right of Way."
- C. The Water Authority has a capital improvement project, Q0302 Vallecitos Water District 11/Vista Irrigation District 12 Flow Control Facility Rehabilitation, that will replace existing water facilities including a 16-inch-diameter steel pipeline serving VWD.
- D. VWD is a public agency/utility that owns or will own the 16-inch-diameter steel pipeline downstream of the cathodic protection isolation joint (VWD's Pipeline) in the real property subject to the Water Authority's right of way.

WHEREAS, VWD desires to obtain the Water Authority's consent for the operation and maintenance of VWD's Pipeline in, over, under, and across Water Authority's right of way as within a joint use area described in Exhibit "A" and as shown on Exhibit "B", (Joint Use Area);

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties mutually hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The above recitals herein are incorporated into this agreement.
- 2. The Water Authority authorizes VWD, subject to consent of the City, and any successor public agency or public utility to operate and maintain VWD's Pipeline in, over, under, and across the Water Authority's right of way within the Joint Use Area, under the terms and conditions stated herein.

- 3. Plans for the subsequent alterations to VWD's Pipeline, including protection of Water Authority facilities, shall be submitted to the City and Water Authority in advance of construction. No construction by VWD shall occur until the City and Water Authority approve the plans. The Water Authority's approval of the plans may be withheld, as the Water Authority deems reasonably necessary to protect its interests and to minimize impacts on its facilities and operations. The Water Authority agrees to process the plans and approve, conditionally approve, or reject the plans within a reasonable time. Notice of subsequent alterations to VWD's Pipeline shall be provided to the City and Water Authority two weeks in advance to provide for the scheduling of inspection.
- 4. Nothing in this Joint Use Agreement shall be construed to diminish any of the Water Authority's property rights. This Joint Use Agreement is in the nature of a license and the Water Authority's right of way shall remain and continue in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected by the Water Authority's consent contained herein. The Water Authority may terminate the license upon determination that the license or uses authorized by this Agreement are incompatible with Water Authority's uses of the Joint Use Area.
 - 5. VWD agrees not to interrupt the use or operation of Water Authority's facilities.
- 6. VWD shall, at its sole expense, remove and replace, rearrange, or relocate VWD's Pipeline as may be necessary for the Water Authority's use and enjoyment of its easement and right of way. Except in the event of an emergency, the Water Authority agrees to provide VWD written notice to remove and replace, rearrange, or relocate VWD's Pipeline. Upon receipt of the notice by VWD the parties shall meet within 30 days, or such time as mutually agreed upon, to develop a plan to incorporate the removal, replacement, rearrangement, or relocation of VWD's Pipeline as part of the Water Authority's project; or, alternatively, to develop a separate plan for the removal, replacement, rearrangement, or relocation of VWD's Pipeline under a mutually agreeable time-frame. Absent exigent circumstances, the parties shall mutually agree in writing to a plan and schedule for the removal, replacement, rearrangement, or relocation not less than 60 days after the Water Authority's written notice. Plans for removal and replacement, rearranging, or relocation of VWD's Pipeline shall be subject to paragraph 3, above, however, no time shall be charged against VWD for that period of time the plans are pending the Water Authority's review. In the event of an emergency affecting the public health, safety, or welfare, as determined by the Water Authority, or VWD's failure to remove and replace, rearrange, or relocate VWD's Pipeline within the time and schedule mutually agreed upon, then the Water Authority may remove VWD's Pipeline without obligation to VWD, at their expense. This Agreement shall continue to apply when VWD's Pipeline is replaced, rearranged, or relocated pursuant to this paragraph.
- 7. This Agreement shall run with the land and be binding upon both parties, its representatives, agents, successors, and assigns.
- 8. The Water Authority has certain property interests as provided in Exhibit "A", and may not assign any of those rights without the express consent of the City. City consents to the use as strictly provided herein under the terms and conditions of this agreement. The parties understand and agree that this Agreement grants the consent of the Water Authority and the consent of the City of Escondido for the activities identified under the terms and conditions stated herein to be situated within the Joint Use Area.

- 9. VWD shall save, indemnify, and hold harmless the Water Authority against any liability, loss, cost, damage, and expense caused by or arising from (i) an act(s) or omission(s) of VWD, its employees, agents, contractors, successors and assigns or (ii) the location and existence of VWD's Pipeline, whether defective or otherwise; including, but not limited to any such loss, cost, damage, liability, and expense arising from damage to or destruction of real and personal property or injury to or death of any person; provided, however, that VWD's duty to indemnify and hold harmless shall not include any claims or liability arising from the established sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Water Authority, its agents, officers, or employees. VWD shall also hold harmless the Water Authority against damage to or destruction of VWD's Pipeline caused by an act(s) of a third party(s). If the Water Authority removes the VWD's Pipeline pursuant to paragraph 6, VWD agrees to release and waive any responsibility or claim against the Water Authority on account of removal completed pursuant to paragraph 6.
- 10. VWD and the Water Authority shall save, indemnify, and hold harmless the City against any liability, loss, cost, damage, and expense caused by or arising from (i) an act(s) or omission(s) of VWD and the Water Authority, or their employees, agents, contractors, successors, and assigns; (ii) the location and existence of VWD's Pipeline, whether defective or otherwise; including, but not limited to any such loss, cost, damage, liability, and expense arising from damage to or destruction of real and personal property or injury to or death of any person; provided, however, that VWD's and the Water Authority's duty to indemnify and hold harmless shall not include any claims or liability arising from established sole negligence or willful misconduct of the City, its agents, officers, or employees. VWD and the Water Authority shall also hold harmless the City against damage to or destruction of VWD's Pipeline caused by an act(s) of a third party(s).
- 11. VWD's Pipeline shall be maintained in a safe and sanitary condition at the sole cost, risk, and responsibility of VWD and their successors in interest without exception, including but not limited to any damages to VWD's Pipeline caused by the Water Authority's maintenance or construction activities.
- 12. Any notice required, permitted, or contemplated under this Agreement shall be deemed given when actually delivered or when deposited in the mail, certified or registered, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

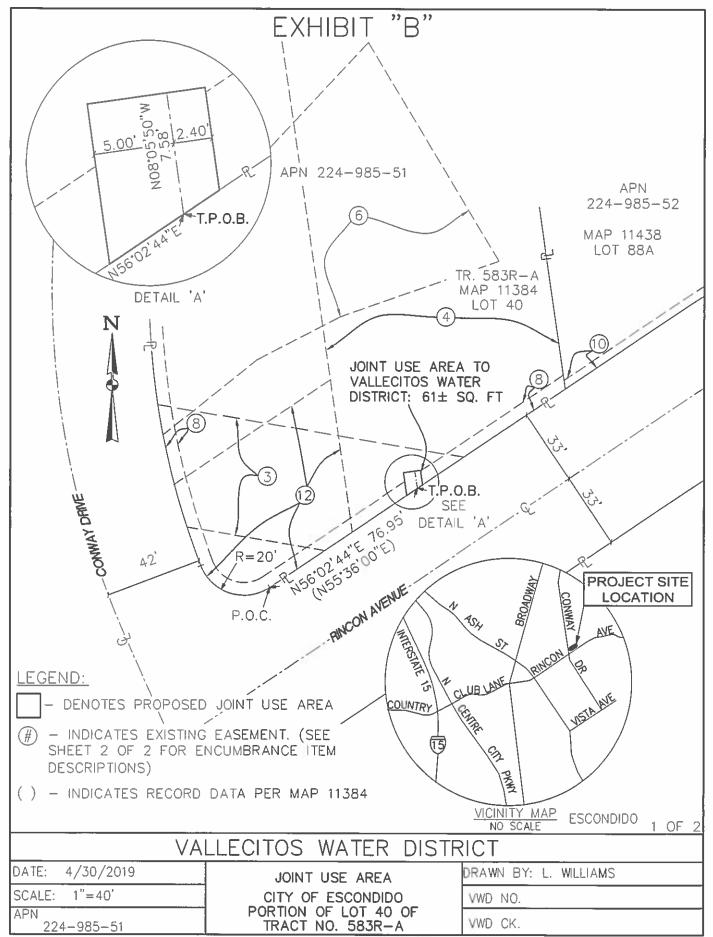

The Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), requires all public agencies to adopt and maintain a conflict of interest code establishing the rules for disclosure of personal assets and the disqualification from making or participating in the making of any decisions that may affect any personal assets designating positions and establishing disclosure categories.

Pursuant to Section 87306 of the Act, the District must amend its Code when necessitated by changed circumstances including the creation of new positions that must be designated, revises the titles of existing positions, revised disclosure categories, updates and clarifies language.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF THE VALLECITOS WATER DISTRICT

(Adopted September 5, 2018- Amended September 2, 2020)

1. Standard Code of FPPC

The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Gov. Code, §§ 81000, et seq.) requires each state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest codes. The Vallecitos Water District has adopted heretofore such a code which should be revised and updated. The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs., §Section 18730)—, that which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code that can be incorporated beby reference as a district's code. After public notice and hearing, the regulation Section 18730 may be amended by the FPPC Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act.

Adoption of Standard Code of FPPC

The terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 18730, and any future amendments to it duly adopted by the FPPC, are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the appendix attached hereto designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Vallecitos Water District. This code shall take effect when approved by the San Diego County Board of Supervisors and shall thereupon supersede all prior codes adopted by the Vallecitos Water District.

Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation (attached) and the attached Appendix designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Vallecitos Water District (the "District"). This code shall take effect when approved by the

San Diego County Board of Supervisors and shall thereupon supersede all prior codes adopted by the Vallecitos Water District.

3. Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

Pursuant to Section 4 of the standard code, designated employees set forth in the appendix shall file statements of economic interests with the executive secretary of the Vallecitos Water District. Upon receipt of the statements of the members of the board of directors and the general manager, the executive secretary shall make and retain copies and forward the originals of these statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for the County of San Diego. Statements for all other designated employees shall be retained by the Vallecitos Water District.

All officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the General Manager as the District's Filing Officer. The Filing Officer shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by the General Manager and Members of the Board of Directors, and forward the originals of such statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. The Filing Officer shall retain the original statements of all other officials and designated positions and will make this Code and all retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction during regular business hours (Gov. Code § 81008).

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of economic interests that the designated position must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.³ "Investment" means financial interest in any business entity (including a consulting business or other independent contracting business) and are reportable if they are either located in, doing business in, planning to do business in, or have done business during the previous two years in the jurisdiction of the District.

- A. Persons holding positions listed in the Appendix are required to file the initial, annual, and leaving office statements of financial interest required by this code for the types of interests in the categories set forth in the column "Disclosure Categories" opposite the column "Designated Positions." It has been determined that these persons make or participate in making decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on such financial interests.
- B. Where the disclosure category requires disclosure of interests in real property, the designated employee need only disclose real property that is located in whole or in part within or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two miles of any land owned or used by the local government agency.
- C. Where the disclosure category requires disclosure of investments or sources of income, the designated employee need only disclose investments in business entities and sources of income that do business in the jurisdiction, plan to do business in the jurisdiction, or have done business in the jurisdiction within the past two years. In addition to other activities, a business entity is doing business within the jurisdiction if it owns real property within the jurisdiction.
- D. Where the disclosure category requires disclosure of business positions, the designated employee need only disclose positions of director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or any positions of management in organizations or enterprises operated for profit.
- <u>Category: 1</u>: All investments and sources of income. All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income located in, that do business in or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District.
- <u>Category: 2</u>: All interests in real property <u>which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of the District.</u>

This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside this agency's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the functions or duties of the position. (Reg. 18730.1)

<u>Category 3</u>: <u>All</u> investments and business positions in, <u>business entities</u> and sources of income <u>from</u>, <u>business entities that are which</u> engaged in land development, construction, or the acquisitions or sale of real property, <u>and all interest in real property within the jurisdiction of the District</u>.

<u>Category 4</u>: <u>All</u> Investments and business positions in, <u>business entities</u> and sources of income <u>from</u>, <u>which</u> <u>business entities that</u> provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, <u>vehicles</u> or equipment of the type <u>utilized by the agency purchased or leased by the District</u>.

<u>Category 5:</u> All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the <u>District.</u>

<u>Category 6:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, if such entities or sources have filed claims against the agency in the past 2 years, or have a claim pending before the District.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE VALLCITOS WATER DISTRICT ADOPTING AN AMENDED CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code Section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Vallecitos Water District (the "District") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors adopted a Conflict of Interest Code (the "Code") which was adopted on September 5, 2018, in compliance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, subsequent changed circumstances within the District have made it advisable and necessary pursuant to Sections 87306 and 87307 of the Act to amend and update the District's Code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in the District being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Board of Directors of, the proposed amended Code was provided each affected designated employee and publicly posted for review at the offices of the District; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Code at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors on September 16, 2020, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Vallecitos Water District, that the Board of Directors does hereby adopt the proposed amended Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the Assistant Board Secretary and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Conflict of Interest Code shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego for approval and said Code shall become effective immediately after the Board of Supervisors approves the proposed amended Code as submitted.

SUBJECT: COVID FINANCIAL REPORTING PRESENTATION

BACKGROUND:

The COVID pandemic has had far reaching impacts on society and has resulted in significant changes in how businesses and citizens act. Of particular interest to Vallecitos is how those societal changes may affect District operations and finances. In preparing the FY2021 budget, staff developed a series of assumptions to estimate the financial impact that COVID may have on the District.

Several discussions have taken place with the Finance Committee and the Board in conjunction with the budget development regarding metrics that could be developed and tracked to determine the accuracy of the assumptions made in the preparation of the budget. Staff committed to providing monthly updates of the financial tracking metrics to the Board.

DISCUSSION:

Staff will be providing an update on the financial tracking metrics at the September 16, 2020 Board meeting. The information provided will reflect conditions up to August 31, 2020. This is the second month in which information can be compared to the assumptions developed for the FY2021 budget. Because it is only the second month of the Fiscal Year, we are not yet able to identify trending patterns in the data. Subsequent updates will determine the direction in which certain metrics are trending and enable the Board and staff to determine the need for any budget-related course corrections.

It may take several additional months for patterns to emerge and it would be advisable to receive several more monthly reports before any changes are considered. In addition, it is important to note that several of the indicators/metrics have a built-in time lag, meaning the data presented does not necessarily reflect the results for the month in which the data is presented. For example, when staff reports in September on water sales, the data will be for August billings, which reflect July usage. This time lag is important when the District is trying to correlate the data it compiles with how society is reacting to COVID-related restrictions.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There are no fiscal impacts associated with receiving the staff presentation. The information provided will enable the District to determine how well the data compares to the estimates upon which the Fiscal Year 2021 budget was prepared.

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive the staff presentation and provide direction as appropriate.

SUBJECT: 2020 YEAR IN REVIEW PRESENTATION

BACKGROUND:

Revenue and Expense Reports for water and sewer and the Reserve Report are included in the Board packets every month to keep the Board informed about the financial status of the District. The Board is also provided a Monthly Reserve Report with explanations of reserve levels, how they compare to the reserve policy floor and ceiling, and illustrating reserve levels in comparison to prior years. In addition, a Quarterly Financial Report narrative is provided to the Board summarizing the results of operations, providing budget comparisons, and explaining significant budget variances.

At the conclusion of each fiscal year staff plans to provide a timely review of annual financial results. The information being presented was included in the Board packet on July 15th and was discussed with the Finance Committee on July 27th.

DISCUSSION:

Staff will be providing an update on the preliminary results of operations as of June 30, 2020. It's important to note that these are preliminary numbers and they are unaudited. Significant changes may be made leading up to the audit in order to be in compliance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). For example, numerous invoices come in after year end for materials delivered and services performed during the year and they are not included here. Changes to these numbers will be reflected in the audited financial statements which will be presented in November.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There are no fiscal impacts associated with receiving the staff presentation.

RECOMMENDATION:
